## Jeffersonian Presidency (1800 - 1808)

### The Election of 1800:

### Jefferson's New Policies

#### Laissez faire-

Jefferson did this as a result of the idea of laissez faire:

- Fired all tax collectors
- Cut the number of US Diplomats

He kept these ideas of the Federalists:

- US had to pay of national debt
- He did not fire Federalist office holders
